BACK FLOW PREVENTION

What is Backflow Prevention

Backflow prevention devices are installed at cross-connections in your plumbing system to ensure that backflow-causing pressure changes don't lead to a contamination of your drinking water.

How Rising Wholesale Natural Gas Prices Affect You

We would like you to be aware of a significant increase in wholesale natural gas prices over the next couple of days. This wholesale natural gas cost is passed directly to our customers without markup.

With the increased cost of natural gas, you may want to consider reducing your use of natural gas over the next couple of days as a way to control your energy bill.

The biggest step you can take to conserve is by lowering your thermostat a few degrees if you have a natural gas furnace. Key ways to save include:

- Lowering your thermostat
- Letting the sunlight in and keep the cold out.
- Making sure exterior doors are fully closed
- Using fans to your advantage
- Keeping your oven's heat where it belongs

- Lowering your water heater's temperature or insulate it
- Keeping filters clean
- Don't let the heat escape
- Improving insulation

Prevent Frozen Household Pipes

- WRAP EXPOSED PIPES WITH INSULATION AND ELIMINATE SOURCES OF COLD AIR NEAR ANY WATERLINES
- ALLOW A SMALL TRICKLE OF WATER TO RUN OVERNIGHT TO KEEP PIPES FROM FREEZING. THE COST OF THE WATER IS MINIMAL COMPARED TO REPAIRING THE DAMAGE FROM BURSTING PIPES.
- KNOW THE LOCATION OF YOUR MAIN WATER SHUT-OFF VALVE. IF A PIPE FREEZES OR BURSTS, SHUT THE WATER OFF IMMEDIATELY.
 - DO NOT ATTEMPT TO THAW FROZEN PIPES UNLESS THE WATER IS SHUT OFF. TO THAW PIPES, APPLY HEAT FROM A HAIR DRYER, SPACE HEATER, OR HOT WATER.
