Water Rates

Starting January 1, 2024 water and sewer rates will increase. The bill you receive at the beginning of February will reflect the increase. Water will go up by 1% and Sewer will go up by 5%.

Calling for Nominations

The Town of La Jara will hold its regular municipal election on April 2, 2024. There is one (l) Mayor seat and four (4) trustee seats up for election. The mayor will serve a four-year term. Three trustees will serve a four-year term and one will serve a two-year term.

Nomination petitions to serve as a trustee are available at Town Hall (221 Broadway). Petitions can be circulated beginning Tuesday, January 2, 2024 and must be returned to Town Hall no later than 5 pm on Monday, January 22, 2024. Every registered elector 18 years or older who has resided within the city limits of the Town of La Jara for 12 consecutive months immediately prior to the election is eligible to be a candidate. Each candidate must have a minimum of 10 registered voters' signatures on the petition.

Think twice before leaving your car running unattended. Car thieves are on the lookout for these vehicles warming up in driveways.



Water Rates vs. Broken Pipe

With the last couple of months it has been colder than usual. With the nights and mornings being colder, more issues with water systems may rise. We understand that letting your faucets trickle may cause an increase on your water bill; but the little extra you may have to pay for letting your water trickle may save you a lot more then a busted pipe. A typical repair for broken pipes can range any where from \$150 to \$500. A base rate water bill is \$61.25 plus additional usage. (Example: A household that uses 19 (19,000 gallons) units of water will have a bill of \$87.55 that is including both water and sewer.)



NEW YEAR'S EVE SAFETY TIPS

Don't Drink and Drive

42% of traffic fatalities during the New Year's period are due to drinking and driving. If you plan on drinking, designate a driver. Keep contact info for local cab companies on hand. If someone is too impaired to drive, take their keys to prevent them from getting behind the wheel.



Keep Pets Safe



Pets can get spooked from all the holiday excitement. In case they get loose, make sure your pet is wearing an ID tag before the night begins, and keep them in a secur location in your home.

Be a Responsible Host

If you're part of the 23% of the U.S. population that plans on entertaining at home, have non-alcoholic drinks available for your guests. Stop serving alcohol hours before the party ends.



Stay Alert



Before the night begins, charge your phone. Be aware of your surroundings. If you see suspicious activity, call the police. Remain social media smart and don't post your whereabouts, which could invite burglars to see you aren't home.

Use Fireworks Safely

Purchase fireworks from a reliable source. When using them, observe local laws. Find an open area clear of power lines and homes. Also, make sure a responsible adult is supervising children and pets.
