## Be Conservative

As the weather gets warmer and you use more water by watering your lawn, you will see your water usage increase. There are many ways to conserve the usage of water. Some examples are don't run the dish washer if its not completely loaded, same with the washer make sure it is a full load, or don't let the sink run as you brush your teeth. There are many ways to use less water.

**HOW YOU CAN HELP CONSERVE WATER WHILE AT HOME** Bague+

- Plant drought tolerant Florida native trees and shrubs.
- Add an automatic shut off nozzles to you watering hose.
- Limit your shower to less than 5 minutes, better yet switch to a low-flow shower head.
- Do not throw away that pasta water, save it to water your plants.
- Turn off the water while brushing your teeth or washing your hands.
- Take advantage of Miami-Dade County's Water Conservation Rebates for residents.
- Wash full loads of laundry only in the washer, same goes for your dish washer.
- Water your plants of your lawn during cool parts of the day to help with evaporation.
